Giving DAST Your Long Term Support

DAST are a registered charity and we do not ask for any payment from those who need to access our services. Each home visit costs in the region of £100, and we also need funds to get out into the community and work with people who have been affected by asbestos.

Asbestos will not be eradicated at any time in the near future. It is estimated that 90% of all public sector housing contains asbestos and it is commonly found in schools and other public buildings.

We need people to consider supporting us well into the future. A Legacy or an In Memoriam collection is an ideal way to ensure DAST can carry on our work for years to come.
